Good afternoon,

Welcome to Hednesford Town's Keys Park for this historic occasion as we entertain Nottingham Forest in the third round of the Adobe Women's FA Cup. We've certainly been making history this season as our second round game against Stoke was the first time the team had ever been shown on national television. Today's fixture is not only being shown live on TNT Sports, it's also our first time on free-to-air television as it's being shown live on Channel 4 in their first ever coverage of the competition.

It's another amazing opportunity for us as we continue to break records. Last Sunday's league victory over Liverpool Feds extended our league record to an incredible 30 matches unbeaten, stretching back to September 2024. And when we look back at this calendar year, the only team to beat us was WSL side Manchester United in last season's FA Cup fifth round.

We've reached the halfway point of the season and we certainly didn't expect to be where we are in the table, going toe to toe with an excellent Burnley side. But we know there's still a long way to go and we have to continue the hard work if we want to achieve our ambitions. We're seeing out the year with our first Black Country derby of the season when we travel to Alexander Stadium in Birmingham next Sunday afternoon to take on West Bromwich Albion in our rearranged league game.

But before that, today gives us our toughest test since that Manchester United game as we take on our old rivals Nottingham Forest. We've had plenty of tricky encounters over the years and with Forest now impressing in the second tier, they'll certainly be the favourites. Everyone thinks it will be a formality, but we want to prove them wrong. This is the strongest group I've ever worked with at Wolves, including the group who were previously at Forest. We now have that strength in depth and real competition for places and we want to show that this group isn't far off being ready to compete in WSL2.

A big thank you to Hednesford Town for hosting us. We were here for our Birmingham Challenge Cup fixture back in October and were really impressed with the pitch and facilities. It's great to have our dedicated supporters here, who I know will be making plenty of noise, and welcome to any Wolves fans joining us for the first time today too. Can I take this opportunity to wish you and your families a very happy Christmas.

Enjoy the game.



LYNDSEY'S

FA CUP REUNION

When the third round draw of the Adobe Women's FA Cup was made, there was an almost inevitable sense that Wolves would be paired with Nottingham Forest.

A recent third tier league rivalry defined by title races, promotion battles and goal difference was being renewed again, but this time in the cup. However, when the teams meet each other once again this afternoon, there will be one key difference, Forest legend Lyndsey Harkin will be on the other side.

After captaining her hometown club for several years, anchoring the back line through derby days, FA Cup runs and promotion into the second tier, Harkin moved to Wolves in the summer. It was a shift between two ambitious clubs whose rivalry has intensified across the past five seasons, as both pushed to be playing WSL2 football.

Yet the switch never diluted her connection to the club she grew up supporting. She remains a Forest ambassador, still rooted in a family of Reds, and now, only months removed from her final appearance at the City Ground, she finds herself preparing to face the club that she gave most of her footballing career to.

And she'll be doing this in a match that marks a landmark moment for the women's game – the first ever Women's FA Cup tie to be shown live on Channel 4. If the footballing gods were trying to create a spectacle, they've succeeded.

But for Harkin, the emotions ahead of today's tie aren't ones of confliction, "To be honest, I think it's just excitement," she said.

"There's been so many battles between the sides over the years that it's such a great fixture to be in the third round of the FA Cup. I think it's just exciting all round really.

"We know it's going to be a challenge, but it's excitement, and it brings that sort of edge to it. So many of the fixtures between the two teams have been really close over the years and we've always been rivals in the league, so we know it's going to be a good challenge."

The two teams have been inseparable foes in recent seasons – sometimes literally side-by-side in title races, often separated by only a point or two in the table, and even goal difference has been used to split the teams. With Dan McNamara's Wolves now consisting of several recent Reds, including Harkin, Charlotte Greengrass, Becky Anderson and Amy Sims, this familiarity made the tie feel almost destined to happen.

"Before the draw came out, me and a few of the girls were talking, and I just knew it was going to happen. I just had a feeling.

"I guess because we've been playing each other for so long, it's kind of inevitable that Wolves and Forest wouldn't go a season without playing each other, but it was still kind of funny when it did come out.

"There's quite a lot of us in this Wolves team who have played for both teams, so I think it just brings that little bit of extra excitement. We've had two tough fixtures already in the FA Cup, so I think we knew another tough one was coming.

"With the history between the two teams, I guess it just had to be Forest, who are probably one of the best sides that are in the draw right now with the WSL2 sides coming in at this stage, but for me, it's just an exciting game, a challenge, but one we're all looking forward to."

If the personal storyline isn't enough to elevate this fixture, another TV first certainly does, with the game being beamed into millions of homes via Channel 4.

For the women's game, and particularly for tiers three and four, it is a landmark moment. For Wolves, it's a second consecutive televised FA Cup appearance after their second round win over Stoke City aired live on TNT Sports.

"The game we had against Stoke was great, but when you're in it, you obviously don't know what's being shown, but a few of us watched it back and the way TNT covered it was really good, really eye catching.

"Hopefully it brings that sort of opportunity for girls and young kids to watch the game and sort of see what they can be. We always say, if you can see it, you can be it, and it's just that.

"The opportunity to do that is huge for the women's game, and also for there to be coverage down into tier three is really important, because it's not very visible at times, and the more we can do to make that happen is really important for the growth and the exposure of the game."

Today the Lyndsey Harkin story is at the forefront. But she's approaching the game with calm pragmatism rather than sentimentality, because for Harkin, it's simply another football match, and another chance to extend Wolves' winning streak.

"To be honest, I've not thought too much about it, because really, it's just a game of football and that's how we're all going to be treating it.

"It's not about me, it's about the team, it's about the club and it's about trying to progress in the FA Cup. I know there's going to be all this interest around it, but I don't think it brings anything else other than that.

"We set ourselves a target at the start of the year to try and be in as many competitions as possible come to Christmas, so it's going to be a challenge, but it's one we're really looking forward to."

AMYSIMS

FIRST THING

The first thing I do is that I always have to have a cup of tea in the morning. It just wakes me up, and then I normally have some pancakes. If I haven't watched Match of the Day from the night before, I'll put it on while I get ready. That's always the first thing I have on a matchday, a cup of tea and pancakes, but it is specific to a matchday.

FOOD AND DRINK

What I eat and drink has changed over the years because when I was younger I would only eat a little bit before the game, but I started having pancakes as soon as I wake up, and then once I get to the ground then I'll have beans on toast as well to give myself that extra bit of energy. While I'll normally have a few electrolyte drinks and water, but it has to come after the cup of tea!

TALKING A GOOD GAME

I always get texts off my family members on the morning of the game. My grandma, my mom, my dad, and because I travel into Telford with the 'Notts' girls [Charlotte Greengrass, Lyndsey Harkin and Becky Anderson], they're probably the first people that I speak to about the game. It's quite fun actually, travelling in with some of the other girls, because it's a good way of talking about the game, but also being able to switch off and talk about what we've done over the weekend as well. Knowing those girls before I came to the club has really helped ease us in this season, and with us travelling a little bit of a distance, it helps to get you through the longer nights when it's coming into winter as well.

ON THE HEADPHONES

When it comes to music, I'm quite an easy person as I like a lot of genres, so whoever's on the aux I will trust to put on something I'd enjoy. But if it was my choice, my go to would probably just be any kind of RnB music, but especially old school Chris Brown, Neo, Usher, and then more recent stuff like Rihanna Those kinds of vibes

BUS BUDDIES

When I first came, everyone already seemed to have their particular social groups from last season, so I was just waiting to see where the spaces were! But I get along with everyone and when we're on the bus everyone gets up and has a walk about and goes to all the different kinds of tables, so everyone has their usual spaces, but then we all just go and mingle, especially on the way back – I think everyone gets bored so they just get up and start talking to different people! When I first joined the group, it was a bit weird, because I've been playing against a lot of the girls for so many years in the league, and then coming in you never really know what to expect, but honestly, everyone's been incredible. They've all been so welcoming and there are so many different personalities that just really complement each other well, so I've found settling in a breeze

AT THE GROUND

When I first arrive at the ground, I mainly like to get settled into my seat and then sort out all of the bits and bobs from my bag. Once I'm sorted, I do quite like going out and checking the pitch before the game, I think to just get a bit of fresh air, otherwise you can be sat in the changing room for ages, so it's good to have a walk around and stretch your legs.

GAME MODE

For me, when I get to the ground that's when the nerves start to go a little bit. At that point, I've prepared all I can throughout the week, so then I can just switch off in the changing room, listen to the music and then as soon as the music goes off, refresh over the little details, like set plays, and then it's just about playing the game.

POST-MATCH PLANS

At a home game, a lot of the girls will be up in the social area afterwards, and we'll all sit down for some food, which is quite nice. But sometimes I do like to go back home afterwards for a roast with my family. Even if I do have some of the post-match food, sometimes I'll have two portions because I'll still want the roast! I do sometimes end up on Sunday night crashed out on the sofa in a food coma, but if you're going to do it, after a match is the right time to do it

SWITCHING OFF

On Sunday night I'll put on a TV series and try to wind down, because on Monday morning you've got to switch into work mode. As soon as I wake up and the alarm goes off, you're in a new week and you've got to forget about what happened on the Sunday. For me, Monday is quite a good day to use as a complete switch off, so I just think about work and try to forget about football, and then come Tuesday, you're raring to go with football again. It's what you have to do, especially after some games when emotions are really high and you're either still buzzing after the game or you've had a really bad loss, work forces you to switch off straight away – but when you've had a win, it definitely makes that

Nottingham Forest Women

Nottingham Forest Women were founded in 1990 and have since achieved many honours throughout their acclaimed history. Originally named Nottingham Forest Ladies FC, the Reds previously operated on a volunteer basis for administration and coaching and managed to maintain their status within competitive women's football thanks to their impressive local support in Nottinghamshire.

In 1996 players Donna Hilton and Lisa Dawkins launched Nottingham Forest WFC's junior programme in order to establish a career development pathway for female footballers. Continuing to progress, Forest Women added a reserve team programme in 2005 to bridge the gap between their senior team and junior programmes; this improved further with the addition of a development team programme in 2018.

The Reds found success on the pitch in the 2007/08 season, winning the FA FPL Northern Division title and promotion

to the highest level, going the entire league campaign unbeaten.

Nottingham Forest FC entered a partnership with Forest Women in April 2018 whereby the women's side could access the then, EFL Championship side's resources as well as important support through their financial backing.

The Reds' evolution continued in December 2018, when the club hired their first full-time staff member, recruiting a general manager responsible for increasing standards of the club, on and off the pitch, as they prepared for upcoming promotion campaigns.

The biggest change was implemented ahead of the 2019/20 season. The club revised their name and logo, dropping the word ladies, with both the men's and women's teams committing to a one-club approach for Nottingham Forest FC.

Forest Women then hired their first ever full-time head coach to manage the development of all on-field football aspects for the Reds, from the senior team to the junior programmes. They achieved their most successful season to date by winning the FA Women's National League Cup and FA WNL Northern Premier Division in the 2022/23 season.

In July 2023, Nottingham Forest announced the full integration of Nottingham Forest Women into the wider football department at the club. This saw the women's first team move to a professional hybrid model for the 2023/24 season as phase one of a strategy to ultimately create a full-time professional team.

Last season for the first time they played all home league games at The City Ground and celebrated a league and cup double, winning promotion to WSL2 - the second tier of women's football. Having moved to a fully professional model for the new season they currently sit fifth in the league table.
